Isaiah 6:1-8

¹ In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called to another and said:

“Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;
the whole earth is full of his glory!”

⁴ And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: “Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!”

⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ And he touched my mouth and said: “Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.”

⁸ And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?” Then I said, “Here I am! Send me.”

SUMMARY

This week, Pastor Morris Ogenga from Mbale, Uganda brings a message from Isaiah 6:1-8. This text captures the holiness of God and the holy calling given to His prophet, Isaiah. In Christ, we share in a high and holy calling to the Lord. May we, like Isaiah, take up our call with humility and faithfulness.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What is something you have volunteered to do that made a significant impact on your life?
2. Read 2 Chronicles 26:1-23 and Isaiah 6:1-5. How does the background of 2 Chronicles 26 shed more light on Isaiah's response to seeing God in His glory?
3. Contrast the attitudes and actions between King Uzziah and Isaiah when both men entered God's holy presence.
4. Why might Isaiah focus on his lips specifically, and what might that reveal about the importance of our words before a holy God?
5. Read Isaiah 6:6-8. What does the coal from the altar symbolize about God's way of cleansing and restoring His people?
6. What might a "Here am I, send me" attitude look like in your own life today in your marriage, parenting, ministry, or professional life?
7. What most grabbed your heart or challenged you from this week's sermon?
